Election Update from Katherine Berry (LONG) (NEW)

Good Morning!

I have several updates and helpful information as we lead into early voting week!

1. We have over 13,000 mail in ballot applications currently. We have gotten approximately 2,600 voted ballots back from voters. 1,900 have been via the USPS system. The rest have been through drop boxes and in-person office visits. ***If you know people who selected a mail-in ballot, but have changed their minds and want to vote in-person, please help us educate the voter!! They will only be eligible to vote a provisional ballot in-person, so they really should just try to vote the mail-in ballot. Voters who request a mail-in ballot and then vote provisionally have their ballots canvassed on the FINAL day of canvass, July 29. All of our returned ballot voters should receive notification that we got their ballots this week.

2. The drop boxes are managed by my board members, office staff and I. All drop boxes are under 24/7 surveillance.

3. Voter registration has now closed and final preparations are taking place to prepare the electronic pollbooks for early voting. All data quality checks including a triple check of redistricting was completed. You cannot ask for voter registration data anymore. If you have an application in for mail in ballot data, I will be sending you a listing in the next 48 hours and will do one more on Thursday, July 7. If you have questions, please let me know.

4. Over 116,000 registered voters should've gotten a sample ballot in the mail already. A second and final sample ballot run of people who didn't make it into the first data pull will be sent sample ballots this week. There were 500 people in the data pull.

Regarding Early Voting and Election Day:

1. I plan to provide this email group with turnout stats each day of early voting AND election day around 11am, 4pm and after the close. You will not need to go inside the polling places and ask the election judges for any sort of reports because I will have a full compliment of the data for you.

2. Please abide by the "No Electioneering" zones at all locations. In addition, be mindful of the timeframe to have campaign signs on all of the properties. You should not put any campaign signs on polling place property until after 5pm on July 18 and you should remove all signs by 8am on July 20. Your assistance with this is GREATLY appreciated because building maintenance are otherwise forced to do the clean-up.

3. Of course, you will see me frequently at the early voting centers, so please stop me if you have questions. You also have my cell phone number so that you can text or call if you encounter problems or questions. Please try to keep roadway areas free and clear of electioneers and campaign signs so that we do not impede on traffic flow. Also, at the Senior Centers, please keep in mind that they are open for regular business, so not every person going to the centers are actually voters.

4. If you or your campaign/central committee plan to have any watchers in the early voting centers or polling places, I would greatly appreciate a "head's up" so that I can reiterate procedures with our election judges. Here are the guidelines for you to review and follow, if you are interested.

Finally, we are still in need of approximately 100 election judges. People continue to quit as fast as we can hire them. Election judges are critical to the success of in-person voting. If you know people who aren't involved in your campaign and want to make some extra \$\$\$, please give them my contact information.

I hope that you will help us make the next 3 weeks successful and keep communication open with me if you have questions about absolutely anything going on. I will be in contact with all of you daily and provide any other important information as it arises. I will be reviewing mail-in ballot canvass rules in my July 14 update.

Katherine Berry at the Board of Elections sent us a NEW page to use:

This page has all the Sample Ballots, each variation linked INDIVIDUALLY. They are grouped by Party, and then by which precincts/districts use each one. There are only 8 Democratic variations.

Scroll down past the 16 Republican variations, then find the "Sample Ballot Dem" heading/link which matches your precinct/district. For instance, I'm in precinct 5, district 2, so I looked for "005-002", voting place "Oklahoma Road Middle School". That was under "Sample Ballot Dem 1". I clicked on the linked heading, and see a single, simple, 2-page ballot PDF.

(Rather than the massive combined PDF from before.)



Mail-In Ballots - Answers

From Katherine Berry, Election Director, Carroll County Board of Elections:

To clarify a few questions that I've received regarding the mail in ballots:

1. Military and overseas ballots were sent out prior to the June 4 deadline.
2. Domestic mail in ballots are expected to be in the mailstream June 9 with arrival in voter mailboxes on June 13.
3. We will have a tracking system for voter's ballots available on our website and social media in the next week or so. The State Board of Elections is putting final touches on this system, so I will alert you when it's available for any of your constituents that may be wondering where their ballot is.
4. Drop boxes will be delivered to 6 locations on June 7. SBE has instructed us to open these boxes on June 13. Election officials will be monitoring all of the boxes and managing the pick-up of materials just as we did in 2020.
5. The first canvass of mail in ballots will occur on July 21 at 10am. This is open to the public and will be held at the Robert Moton Center Gymnasium. Since this is AFTER Election Day, the results on election night will only encompass early voting and election day totals. Currently, we have a little over 10,400 applications received.

The deadline to request a registered voter list is on June 28, which is also the close of registration. If you are doing voter registration drives, please focus on ensuring people are getting their applications by this date to be sure they have a smooth in person voting process.

If you know of anyone who is NOT working on a campaign, but would like to be a part of the process, we are hiring election judges! Summer elections are particularly difficult to recruit for, so absolutely anyone who is a registered voter could be an election judge and make some extra cash. Please refer them to our [website](#).

Sample ballots are still scheduled to begin going out in late-June, but you can refer to our [website](#) for all of the ballot

styles.

Thank you for your continued patience with my office as we get information out to the public. Please do not hesitate to reach out to me with any questions - no matter how minor you think they are - I will get back to you.

By Address

If you prefer to search by address, you can do that as well.
